CITY TOURS

CITY HIGHLIGHTS

What You'll Do

- Tour the Peter and Paul Fortress, and learn about the city's founding
- Admire St. Isaac's Cathedral and its spectacular gold dome
- See the collection of mosaics at the Church on Spilled Blood
- Admire the immense Palace Square, home to the city's Winter Palace
- Take in panoramic views of the whole city, including the 5 buildings of the State Hermitage Museum

St. Petersburg is a mecca for lovers of beauty. This 4-hour guided tour is an excellent introduction to the second largest and most beautiful city in Russia. You will see all St. Petersburg most famous sights from the comfort of a car or mini van and with a knowledgeable and experienced guide. The imperial city of golden spires, golden domes, pastel palaces and picturesque canals is waiting for you.

NIGHT HIGHLIGHTS

What You'll Do

- Experience the special flair of a white night in St. Petersburg
- Enjoy the magic of the white nights during the stunning Neva bridge opening
- Enjoy the maritime atmosphere of a boat tour along the St. Petersburg channels
- Get a city overview at night with several stops near the Church on Spilled Blood, St. Isaac Cathedral and more

Take 4-hour illuminations tour along the spectacular floodlit monuments. This excursion combines a sightseeing drive to those landmarks of the city which are getting most fascinating when the night is getting on. Magical and magnificent by night, a drive through St. Petersburg and its beautiful illuminated buildings should not be missed by any visitor of the northern capital. Then follow the guide on a boat tour to witness the special moment of the opening of the bascule bridges across the Neva River after midnight.

TOUR OF THREE CATHEDRALS

What You'll Do

- Admire the marvelous exterior of St. Isaac's Cathedral
- Visit the Church of Our Savior on the Spilled Blood, the site where Emperor Alexander II was assassinated
- Learn about Russian religion and the internal structure of the Russian Church in Kazan Cathedral

On a 4-hour guided tour will introduce you to three of the most famous Cathedrals of St. Petersburg. On your way you will see plenty of other attractions including amazing panoramas, monuments, historical buildings and the so called "St. Petersburg golden triangle". The first Cathedral, St. Isaac Cathedral is a great work of the late period of classical architecture. It is richly decorated with sculptures, high reliefs, oil paintings and mosaics. You will be invited to climb the cathedral colonnade and contemplate St. Petersburg from above with a bird's eye view. The second place of interest is the Church of Our Savior of the Spilled Blood, a rare example of a traditional Russian church. It is really unique because it is decorated with 7000 square metres of mosaics. Lastly you will get to see the main cathedral of the city, Kazan Cathedral which is located in Nevsky Prospect. Whilst the first two cathedrals of the tour have been turned into museums, it is still an active orthodox church.

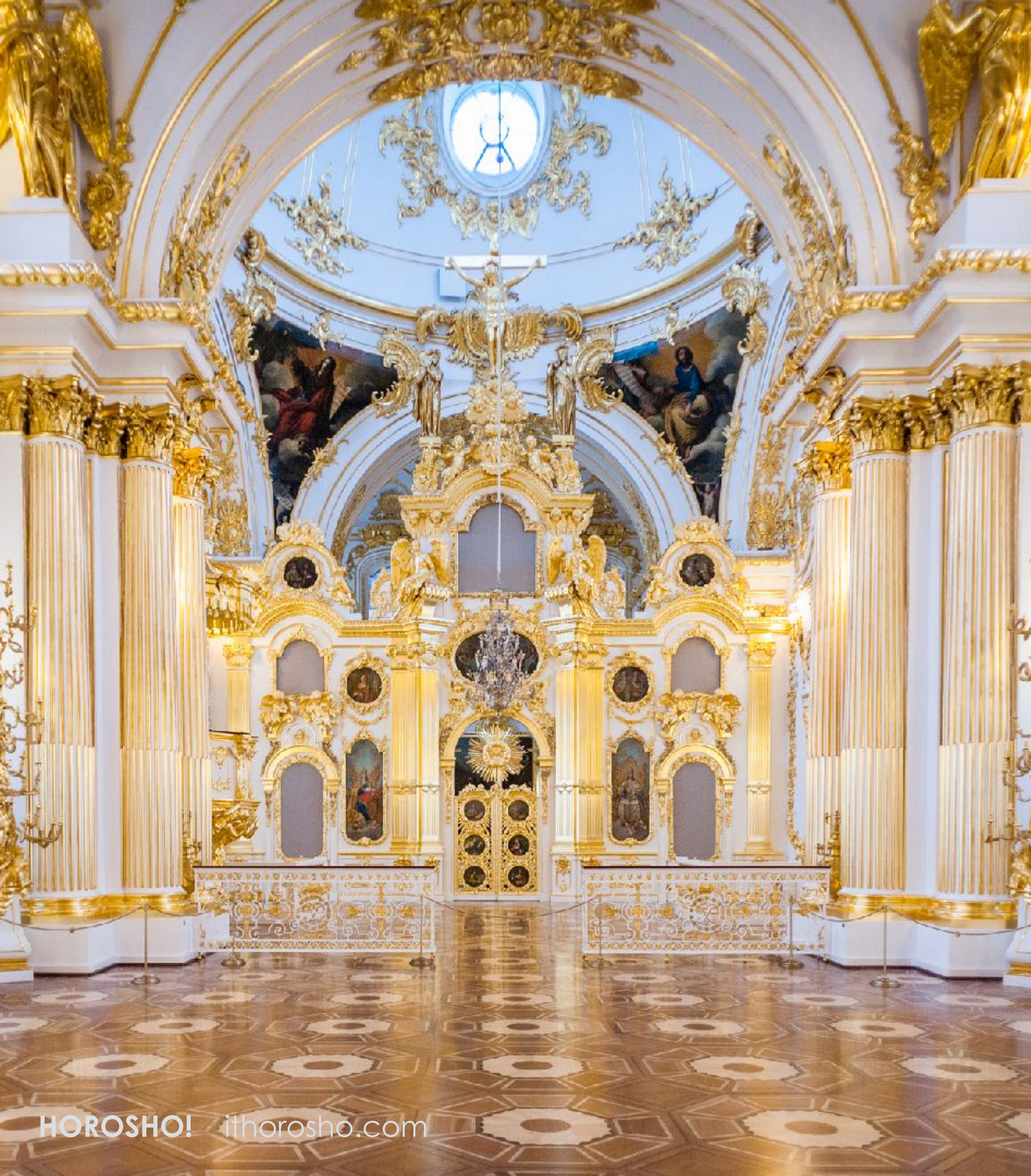
HERMITAGE MUSEUM

What You'll Do

- Wander through some of the most elaborate state rooms of the Winter Palace
- Be impressed and astounded by the breadth of the Tzar's personal art collections
- Enjoy one of the world's greatest collections of Western European paintings
- Learn the stories behind the pieces in the Hermitage collection

Explore the state rooms and royal chambers of the Russian tsars on a 3-hour guided tour of one of the most famous museums in the world. Spread over several buildings of the former winter residence of the royals, and located on the banks of the Neva River. Starting with 225 paintings purchased in 1764 by Catherine the Great, the museum collection now comprises more than 3 million works of art and cultural artifacts, making it an unforgettable exhibition of world culture. . To view the collection in its entirety, assuming you spent 8 hours a day and just 1 minute to examine each exhibit, would take almost 15 years. On this tour you will admire the priceless art collections of the Russian Tsars including Italian, French, Spanish, Dutch and Flemish artists.

HERMITAGE MUSEUM TREASURE GALLERIES

What You'll Do

- Discover architectural and historical wonders
- Get insider access to the world of the tsars and emperors
- Explore the Hermitage Museum's Treasure Galleries with a personal private guide
- Examine the development of the jeweler's craft through history, which goes as far back as the 3rd millennium BC

The collection at the Treasure Galleries holds a very rich selection of jewellery masterpieces owned by the Russian Imperial family. Two magnificent halls present their visitors with many master works of jewellery from various countries, belonging to different epochs, from ancient times to the early 20th century. The first gallery, called the Golden Rooms has works from Eurasia, the Black Sea Littoral in antiquity, and the Orient. It consists of around 1,500 works made from gold and dating from the 7th century B.C. to the 19th century A.D. The main idea of the second section, which is called the Diamond Rooms, is to show the development of the jeweler's craft over the course of mankind's many centuries of history from the third millennium B.C. to the start of the 20th century.

FULL DAY CITY TOUR

- See the Hermitage Museum and discover the great works within its walls
- Visit the Peter and Paul Fortress and learn about the founding of the city
- Admire the marvelous exterior of St. Isaac's Cathedral and its massive gold dome
- Explore the Church of the Spilled Blood, the site where Emperor Alexander II was assassinated

Experience all the highlights of St. Petersburg on a 8-hour guided private tour. We will present you three centuries of St. Petersburg in this full day tour. You will see the most wonderful and famous places, squares, churches and cathedrals of the city. Not too many cities in the world can compete with a number of historical places and architectural beauty of the former Russian capital. PETERHOF PALACE & PARK

What You'll Do

- Wander through the stately Upper Park and see the gorgeous fountains that cover the estate
- Enjoy beautiful views of the Lower Park, including the largest cascade in Europe, "trick" fountains, magnificent flowerbeds and Italian statues
- Tour the Grand Palace and marvel at the interiors representing the styles of different époques

On a 5-hour guided trip from St. Petersburg you'll tour the grounds and the palace of Peterhof. Peterhof was a brainchild of Peter the Great and it was without a doubt his most ambitious project. You will see the Lower Park, which retains its appearance since the middle of 18 century. Later you will walk along its alleys and see the most beautiful fountains. The Upper Park is another part of the Peterhof residence where the oldest fountain "Neptune" is located. There you can get a real feeling of 18 century atmosphere. After a fun walk in the gardens, you will visit the Grand palace, which served as an official royal summer residence until the revolution of 1917. There you will see interiors decorated in baroque, classical and oriental styles.

CATHERINE PALACE IN TSARSKOE SELO

What You'll Do

- Wander through landscaped gardens of the 18th and 19th centuries
- Admire one of the greatest examples of Russian Baroque at Catherine Palace
- Marvel at the famous Amber Room, recreated in 2003 with panels of amber, gold leaf and mirrors

On this 5-hour guided tour you will experience the grandeur of the Russian Baroque palace of Catherine the Great and unlock the secrets of the Amber Room – one of the world's wonders. Step into the world of the empresses Elizabeth and Catherine as you walk through the gilded ballrooms and imperial halls, and marvel at the luxury of the decoration. All Russian monarchs lived, worked, granted audiences, and held diplomatic receptions, gala balls, and masquerades in the gorgeous palace halls. The park that surrounds the palace is a spectacular work of Russian gardening art of the 18th and 19th centuries, which combines masterpieces of architecture with the stunning beauty of nature.

Hint: This tour can be combined with a visit to Pavlovsk to see the imperial estate and park complex of Paul I, the son of Catherine the Great.

PAVLOVSK PALACE & PARK

What You'll Do

- Stroll through the grounds of Pavlovsk Palace, one of the largest landscaped parks in Europe
- Admire the neoclassical Pavlovsk Palace and learn about the interesting period in Russian history it reflects
- Learn about the life of Russian Emperor Paul I and his family

On this 5-hour guided tour you will explore the Pavlovsk Palace, the Gala summer residence of Tzar Paul I, the only legitimate son of Catherine the Great. Be enchanted by this neoclassical residence and its warm lived-in feel, with clear bright interiors and a homely, yet lavish, ambience. You will firstly tour the palace of Emperor Paul, which served as his Gala summer residence when he became the Tzar of Russia in 1796. Following the informative tour of the palace we will walk around the park of this verdant residence. This 600-quadratmeter landscaped garden and the pavilions that decorate the park's different corners are a true delight.

Hint: This tour can be combined with a visit to Tsarskoe Selo to see the imperial estate (Catherine Palace with Amber Room) and park complex of Catherine the Great.

TSARSKOE SELO & PAVLOVSK

What You'll Do

- Admire one of the finest examples of Russian Baroque at Catherine Palace
- Marvel at the famous Amber Room, recreated in 2003 with panels of amber, gold leaf and mirrors
- Stroll through the grounds of Pavlovsk Palace, one of the largest landscaped parks in Europe
- Learn about the life of Russian Emperor Paul I and his family

Explore two of St. Petersburg's imperial summer residences on a 6-hour private tour. Compare the opulence of Russian Baroque in Catherine Palace with the austere Classicism of Pavlovsk Palace. Tsarskoe Selo was developed as a royal country residence by Elizabeth I and Catherine II. Visit the breathtaking Amber Room at Catherine Palace containing stunning mosaic panels made of real amber. The Pavlovsk palace is considered to be one of the finest examples of the classical architecture in Europe. Several ornate rooms and beautiful park grounds containing fine sculptures make this a favorite destination of tourists and locals alike. The Pavlovsk Palace along with the Tsarskoe Selo together form part of a UNESCO Heritage Site. Take a trip to admire these wonderful works of architecture, made during one of the golden ages of Russian history.

PETERHOF & TSARSKOE SELO

What You'll Do

- See the impressive Grand Palace in Peterhof and its amazing mix of baroque and classical styles
- Wander through the stately gardens and see the gorgeous fountains that cover the estate
- Be dazzled by the gold leaf and mirrors lining the Amber Room
- Take a leisurely walk through immaculately landscaped Catherine Park

Enjoy a 6-hour guided tour of Peterhof and Catherine Palace, where you will see magnificent fountains, opulent architecture, and mysterious rooms. You will see this masterpiece of 18th-19th century Russian architecture that at one time was the favourite residence of the royal family. Located on the sea shore The Grand Palace and park complex of Peterhof with its unique array of fountains is considered to be one of the most beautiful in the world. The Grand Palace, filled with fascinating and elaborate interiors, sits on top of a high seashore ridge overlooking the vast Lower Park. Later step into the world of the empresses Catherine the Great as you walk through the gilded ballrooms and imperial halls of Catherine Palace, and marvel at the luxury of its' decoration. Experience the grandeur of the Russian Baroque palace and unlock the secrets of the Amber Room – one of the world's wonders. Also take a stroll down alleys and paths of Catherine Park, an inseparable part of royal ensemble.

YUSUPOV PALACE

What You'll Do

- Visit the Yusupov Palace, one of St. Petersburg's most iconic locations
- Walk through beautiful palace interiors, and admire the gorgeous Moorish Room
- Learn about the murder of Rasputin, which took place in the palace
- See the Yusupovs' impressive home theater

Marvel at the opulence of the palace's interior and learn about the family's prosperity and tragedies, and the fall of Tsarist Russia. One of two surviving St. Petersburg mansions of the extremely rich Yusupov family, the Yusupov Palace on the Moika River, is well known as the scene of the death of Grigory Rasputin, and is one of only a few of privileged homes in the city to have held a large portion of its unique interiors. This mansion is an amazing and beautiful building, with glorious interiors with unique styles and designs. Tour the beauty while uncovering events that took place in the palace which have attracted curious minds from all across the world. Explore St. Petersburg and the Yusupov Palace, and the mysteries that hide within.

RUSSIAN MUSEUM & NEW STAFF BUILDING OF HERMITAGE

What You'll Do

- Discover the largest collection of Russian artwork in the world in Russian Museum
- Visit the restored halls of the General Staff Building which is a part of the Hermitage complex
- See 19th century paintings, Impressionism and Postmodernism art works

The Russian Museum is the hugest national museum in the world and now it is home to more than 400,000 works of art, including ancient icons and examples of the Russian avant-garde movement. On this tour you will visit Mikhailovsky Palace, which contains art collections from ancient times to the 19th century, and the Benois Wing, where the famous Russian avant-garde collection is on display. The General Staff Building, belonging to St. Petersburg's most famous architectural monuments, which was constructed according to architect K.I. Rossi's design in 1820-1828. Before the February Revolution in 1917, it housed supreme state authorities of the Russian Empire. Now it is a part of the Hermitage museum and there you may find dedicated areas demonstrating contemporary art works, the Museum of Guards, as well as halls with restored historical interiors.

FOLK SHOW “FEEL YOURSELF RUSSIAN”

What You'll Do

- Immerse yourself in original Russian folk festivities and get carried away by the colorful foot-stomping
- Enjoy this unique opportunity of getting acquainted with the history and cultural traditions of Russia
- Upgrade to include a visit to the Vodka Museum for a vodka tasting session before the show

As you enter the lobby of Nikolaevsky Palace you will instantly be transported back in time. Performers dressed in stunning 18th century costumes will greet you on the marble staircase to direct you to the stately concert hall. The performance is a joyous concoction of melodious folk songs and traditional dances. Singers and dancers in colorful costumes perform historical pieces from the different provinces of Russia. Their repertoire covers lyrical dances of the Russian North, fierce dances of the Cossacks from the Don and Voronezh and dancing miniatures of the Urals and Siberia with their subtle humor. The show consists of two parts and lasts for 1-hour and 50 minutes in total including a break in the middle. During this interval guests are offered to taste snack bar.

HINT: Also book “Night Highlights City Tour” to enjoy illuminations along the spectacular floodlit monuments after the show

RIVER & CANALS BOAT CRUISE

What You'll Do

- Enjoy a fascinating boat tour along the rivers and canals of St. Petersburg
- See architectural masterpieces, including the world-famous drawbridges of the Neva River
- Cruise down the rivers Neva, Fontanka, and Moika
- Get a different perspective of the imperial buildings of St. Petersburg

Cruise along the rivers and canals of St. Petersburg on a 1,5-hour boat tour of the city's waterways, and get a different perspective of the imperial architecture and monuments, while discovering why the city is known as the Venice of the North. St. Petersburg, built on the delta of the Neva river, is divided by over 150 rivers and canals, and the opportunity to see the architecture of the stunning Baltic city from the water should not be missed! The Neva is one of the world's truly magnificent rivers, and your journey down it and the smaller rivers and canals that split from it, will carry you past gorgeous embankments, opulent palaces and mansions, elegant cathedrals, and the spectacular draw-bridges recognized the world over.

ROOFTOP TOUR

What You'll Do

- Take an unforgettable journey on rooftops
- See spires and domes of the main churches and cathedrals
- Marvel at the breathtaking sights from the most unusual viewing point in the city

You will be standing on the building's tin roof, looking down at tourist boats cruising under green, arched bridges crossing the murky waters of the Fontanka canal, flanked by the white, yellow, beige, and red waffle-like fronts of 18th-century buildings. In the distance, you will see St. Petersburg's most well-known landmarks: the golden dome of St. Isaac's Cathedral and the green, blue, and grey onion domes of the Church of Our Savior on Spilled Blood. Sneaking onto a St. Petersburg rooftop is a great way to see the city, and the easiest way to do so is with an experienced tour guide. To walk along the roofs means to be initiated. After this the city will welcome you as a native. And even if you already have been to St. Petersburg, a walk on the roofs will open the new sides of the beloved city to you. Without a doubt, the roofs are the most romantic places in our city.

TOUR OF PUSHKIN & DOSTOEVSKY MUSEUMS

On this 2.5-hour private walking tour you will have a private guide with you who will be escorting you to both writers' museums. Firstly you will visit Pushkin's apartment spending around 1 hour inside before proceeding on to the Dostoevsky museum. The great Alexander Pushkin was one of the greatest Russian poets that ever settled in St. Petersburg. He was seen bleeding in his apartment after a serious injury that resulted from a fatal duel. The apartment is now a memorial and was his last place of lodging in St. Petersburg. It is full of exhibits and memories.

Fedor Dostoevsky is one of the most famous and talented Russian writers. His novels are philosophical, dark and bright at the same time, sometimes hard to understand and sometimes so impressive that they are hard to forget. Visiting these two apartments will amaze, and introduce you to the poetic works of these well-known writers.

FABERGE MUSEUM

Experience a private guided 1-hour tour of the Faberge Museum in the company of a museum licensed guide. During the tour the museum's headline attraction - nine priceless, imperial Fabergé eggs - are given the full attention they deserve. Only 50 imperial eggs were ever made, right here in St. Petersburg, by jeweler to the tsars Carl Fabergé. Each was given as a lavish Easter gift by the last two tsars to their wives and mothers. Like every imperial egg, those in place here - whether gold or agate, enameled or jeweled - are exquisite.

Beyond the imperial eggs, there are snuff boxes, figurines and fabulous objets d'art from the House of Fabergé and other noted Russian jewelers, plus a gallery of classical Russian paintings and a roomful of religious icons. Shuvalov Palace is a masterpiece in itself; all parquet floors and richly upholstered walls that reflect the sheer opulence of Russia's imperial age. But lovely as the house and its exhibitions are, the imperial eggs - Fabergé's finest works - remain the star attraction. With their extravagance, delicate beauty and tragic, regal history, both they and Carl Fabergé's genius are truly legendary.

SHORETOURS

1-DAY SHORE EXCURSION: CITY HIGHLIGHTS WITH HERMITAGE & PETERHOF

Ideal for first-time visitors looking for an unhurried introduction to St. Petersburg, this 1-day private excursion will take you back to the beginnings of the city and offers an excellent combination of art and outside activities. Spend a day exploring St. Petersburg while your ship is docked in St. Petersburg port.

You will be introduced to the best examples of architecture when driving in the city center. Later visit the Hermitage and wonder about its amazing collection of masterpieces. Travel by car to Peterhof which is also known as the Russian Versailles. Explore the Upper Gardens and Lower Park, considered masterpieces of landscape design. Later discover the stunning halls of the Grand Palace of Peterhof. Your excursion continues with a metro ride and tour of the Church of the Savior on Spilled Blood, which is one of the city's most famous sight, to discover its mosaic-coated interior

8:15-10:30 - City Sightseeing tour which consist of driving and photo stops in the most gorgeous and historical places in St. Petersburg. This tour will surely keep you entertained as your guide will be telling you interesting stories about famous palaces and architectural ensembles.

10:30-13:30 - Inside visits to Peter and Paul Fortress, St. Isaac Cathedral and Colonnade, Church on the Spilled Blood. Enjoy dazzling array of gold onion domes and mosaics of this iconic sight.

13:30-14:30 Lunch (own expense)

14.45-17.30 - Explore one of the world's greatest art collections on a guided tour of the Hermitage. Admire the magnificent art collections of the Hermitage Museum and enjoy learning about their origins and significance with your private guide.

17.45-18.00 - Drive back to the port

2-DAY SHORE EXCURSION

Embark on a 2-day private guided tour of St. Petersburg and immerse yourself in the city's many wonders. This multi-day excursion allows you to delve beneath the surface of some top attractions for a more thorough and rewarding experience. Learn the story behind the onion-domed Church on Spilled Blood, marvel at Peterhof's magnificent fountains and see the ongoing restoration of Catherine Palace, largely destroyed during WWII. Cruise along the canals of this "Venice of the North" and explore both the Hermitage and the city's metro stations: artworks in themselves.



DAY ONE / 9 hours

On your first day you will see the major sites of the palace estates including statues, monuments, rivers and canals, beautiful bridges, cathedrals and palaces, memorial squares and parks. Visit Catherine Palace and view the stunning palace facade which is 1000 feet long. The tour will visit all of the major halls and private rooms. A particular highlight is the Amber Room. Drive to Peterhof and visit Peterhof Fountain Park – built to rival Versailles in France, Peter the Great helped design the 300 acre park and fountains. Stroll through the lower park, and its 150 fountains. Return to St. Petersburg and take the Metro – which is an attraction in itself – find out why they are known as the magnificent "Palaces Underground". Return to the ship.

DAY TWO / 9 hours

On the second day you will have panoramic city tour of St. Petersburg and a visit to the Peter and Paul Fortress + Cathedral. Later visit the Church of Savior on the Spilled Blood & S Isaac Cathedral + Colonnade. Have a break for lunch (own expense). After that visit the Hermitage Museum. Take a canal cruise before returning to the ship at around 6 pm.

3-DAY SHORE EXCURSION

This is the best way to spend 3 days in St. Petersburg! You will see the essential Highlights, from the galleries of the Hermitage to the fountains of Peterhof, and with added extras like a canal boat ride, a visit to the new Faberge Museum and the impressive collection of Impressionist paintings in the General Staff Building of the Hermitage. You will learn about the founding of St. Petersburg, its imperial past, the hardships of WWII, the Cold War period, and right up to modern day life.
